It has been an encouragement and a blessing to all.

Second, and this was totally unexpected, the Lord seems to be sending more and more Christians from Germany to volunteer here at the Homes. This could be spreading by word of mouth or by seeing opportunities posted on the web. We've begun working more closely with Ethnos360 Germany to process these wonderful young believers, each of whom has been a blessing (notice a theme here?) and a joy to have around.
